The Cadiz Cruz-In returns to the community for its 2025 season in little more than a week, with most of its shows taking place as has been tradition along Main Street in downtown Cadiz.

But July's classic car show will move to the West Cadiz Park, as it has in recent years, and the event debuts a new location in September with a show that is slated to take place at the beach at the Lake Barkley State Resort Park.

Organizer Barbara Jones says the car enthusiasts have been invited to the beach.

The first show kicks off downtown on April 5.

Additionally, O'Reilly Auto Parts will sponsor trophies for first-, second- and third-place and for the car show's Best Motorcycle.
