Any property owner still aggrieved by an assessment of real property, after a confer ence with the P.V.A. can file an appeal on Wednesday May 21, 2025 with the Web ster County Clerk's Office by writing a letter identifying the property and stating the reas on for appeal and the Taxpay er's opinion of value to be re viewed by Webster County Board of Assessment Ap peals.

Any property owner failing to appeal to the County Board of Appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by a designated repres entative will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Assessmen Appeals.

Appeals for personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Person al property owners shall be served notice under the provi sions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and ap peal rights granted under the provision of KRS 131.100. The following steps should be

taken when a property owner does not agree with the as sessed value of persona property:

1) Property owner must list under protest (for certification) what they believe to be the fair cash value of the property

2) Property owner must file a written protest directly with the Department of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assess ment

3) This protest must be in ac cordance with KRS 131.110. 4) The final decision of the Kentucky Department of Rev enue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Ap

peals. (The Webster County PVA Of fice is responsible for the assessment of property however, we do not set tax rates or collect taxes.) Jeffrey D. Kelley, P.V.A.
