HENDERSON COUNTY 6 WEBSTER COUNTY 2

Last Wednesday the Trojans faced the Colonels in Henderson and gave up the lead early. The Colonels led the entire game, and despite the Trojans scoring two runs in the sixth inning, they could not make a comeback.

Micah Austin, Caanan Taylor, Trace Hardison, and Dalton Hearn each collected a hit for the Trojans, and Austin and Taylor each earned an RBI. Pryce Percy took the loss for the Trojans; he pitched for five and one-third innings, giving up six runs (four earned) on nine hits, while striking out six and walking three.

HENDERSON COUNTY 10 WEBSTER COUNTY 3

Thursday night, Henderson County came to Dixon and beat the Trojans again, 10-3.

The Colonels took another early lead, scoring five runs in the top of the first inning.

Austin took the loss on the pitcher's mound; he threw for three innings and gave up six runs (five earned) on six hits while striking out one and walking two. Hardison and Rylen Cardwell each collected two hits for the Trojans, while Jackson Edens, Austin, and Brenen Ferrell each added one.

WEBSTER COUNTY 11 OHIO COUNTY 0

The Trojans went to Ohio County on Monday and defeated the Eagles, 11-0.

Cooper Logan earned the win; he pitched seven innings and gave up four hits in the shutout. He struck out six and walked

none. The pitching performance was what the Trojans needed out of Logan as the regular season comes to an end soon.

The offense was led by Trace Hardison (two hits) and Rylen Cardwell (two hits and an RBI). Jackson Edens added one hit, Gunnar Boone added one hit and four RBIs, Canaan Taylor had one hit and one RBI, and Jameson Newton earned one RBI. The Trojans stole nine bases in the game (Edens 3, Zander Snyder 3, Hardison 2, Boone 1) which added to the momentum as they scored 11 runs.

The Trojans played at Trinity Whitesville Tuesday night, will host Hancock County Friday night as they honor their senior players, will host Daviess County and Christian Educational Consortium Saturday. They will host Caldwell County Monday, and go to Marion to play Crittenden County next Tuesday.

NASCAR championship weekend goes to Homestead in 2026

MIAMI — NASCAR's championship weekend will return to Homestead-Miami Speedway next year, marking the first time since 2019 that the title-winners will be crowned at the South Florida track.

NASCAR made the announcement Tuesday. Its three series — the truck series, the Xfinity Series and the Cup Series — will see

their seasons come to a close at Homestead from Nov. 6-8, 2026.

It isn't a permanent return, though: NASCAR said that championship weekends are going to be on a rotation "to ensure that the season's exciting conclusion is shared amongst NASCAR's marquee venues and key markets."

"As we move forward, the rotating model will provide new challenges for competitors as well as opportunities for unique venues to host our loyal fans at NASCAR Championship Weekend," NASCAR executive vice president Ben Kennedy said.

Phoenix will play host to this year's championship weekend again, and NASCAR said it will be part of the title-deciding-location rotation in the future as well.

Address Corrections

Anyone who has not submitted a change of address for 2025 Tax Bills or has a PO Box not listed on their 2025 Tax Bills would need to report this Address Correction. Homestead / Disability Exemption

Any person who turned 65 years of age in 2025 or will be 65 years of age in 2025 that has title to, lives in, and maintains their personal residence would need to stop by the Property Valuation Office or call to sign up for their Homestead Exemption. This Exemption is also available to anyone who is 100% Disabled and receiving payments from a Disability Administrator. If you have already signed up there is no need to call or fill out another application.

Tangible Property

All individuals, partnerships, corporations, and other business entities owning, leasing, or having a beneficial interest in taxable tangible property which is located in Kentucky on January 1 must file a Tangible Property Tax Return. This would include items such as Manufacturing Machinery, Office Equipment, Inventory, etc. Forms may be obtained from our website in *.pdf or *.xls format; https://webstercountypva.com/downloadable-forms/

Assessment Roll

The Webster County Property Assessment roll will be open from Monday, May 5, 2025 through Saturday, May 10, 2025 and from Monday, May 12, 2025 through Saturday, May 17, 2025 and also on Monday, May 19, 2025 for the 2025 Tax Year. Under the Supervision of the P.V.A. or one of the Deputies, any person may inspect the assessment roll.

This is the January 1, 2025 assessment on which the state, county, school, and other districts taxes for 2025 will be due this fall.

Any property owner desiring to appeal an assessment on real property made by the P.V.A. must first request a conference with the P.V.A. We can conference by Telephone, Email, or in Person. To avoid waiting you may want to call ahead and reserve a time. Those individuals who are unable to come in can appeal by writing a letter identifying the property and stating the reason for appeal and the Taxpayer's opinion of value.

Any property owner still aggrieved by an assessment of real property, after a conference with the P.V.A. can file an appeal on Wednesday, May 21, 2025 with the Webster County Clerk's Office by writing a letter identifying the property and stating the reason for appeal and the Taxpayer's opinion of value to be reviewed by Webster County Board of Assessment Appeals.

Any property owner failing to appeal to the County Board of Appeals, or failing to appear before the board, either in person or by a designated representative will not be eligible to appeal directly to the Kentucky Board of Assessment Appeals.

Appeals for personal property assessments shall not be made to the county board of assessment appeals. Personal property owners shall be served notice under the provisions of KRS 132.450(4) and shall have the protest and appeal rights granted under the provision of KRS 131.100.

The following steps should be taken when a property owner does not agree with the assessed value of personal property;

- 1) Property owner must list under protest (for certification) what they believe to be the fair cash value of the property.
- 2) Property owner must file a written protest directly with the Department of Property Valuation within 30 days from the date of the notice of assessment.
- 3) This protest must be in accordance with KRS 131.110.
- 4) The final decision of the Kentucky Department of Revenue may be appealed to the Kentucky Board of Tax Appeals.

(The Webster County PVA Office is responsible for the assessment of property, however, we do not set tax rates or collect taxes.)

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
