Eagles fall to Indians in district clash 90-52

COLUMBIA — Campbellsville couldn't battle back from behind as Adair County prevailed 90-52 in a 20th District boys' basketball game on Friday, Jan. 31. Adair County shot 64.3% (36-of-56) from the field. The Indians shot 58.8% (10-of-17) from three-point range. Adair County shot 72.7% (eight-of-11) from the free throw line. Connor Loy led Adair County to the district win, scoring a game-high 26 points for the Indians. Along with Loy's game-high scoring effort for Adair County, Isaiah Cochran netted 16 points, Brayton Coomer posted 15 points and Dawson Gilbert tallied 14 points. Adair County received scoring from 10 different players. The additional scorers for Adair County were Carter White (six points), Jayden Miller (four points), Lane Grant (three points), Matthew MeJean (two points), Solomon Stonebraker (two points) and Blaine Bardin (two points). Cochran recorded a double-double for Adair County, clearing out a game-high 11 rebounds. Campbellsville shot 36.8% (21-of-57) from the field. The Eagles shot 30.0% (nine-of-30) from three-point range. Campbellsville connected on one of two free throw attempts in the district matchup. Keaton Hord paced Campbellsville, scoring 13 points and claiming seven rebounds for the Eagles. Hord was the only Campbellsville player to reach double figures. Jalen Gribbins (nine points), Cayton Lawhorn (eight points), Christian Hart (seven points), Lee Colvin (six points), Lanigan Price (three points), Rowan

Petett (two points), Andrew Mardis (two points) and Ty Milburn (two points) followed Hord in Campbellsville's scoring column.
