KY 132 East at KY 494 In an effort to keep a driver's time delays at an absolute minimum, the sheriff's office requests drivers encountering a traffic safety checkpoint have their seatbelt on and their operator's license, proof of insurance, and registration receipt readily accessible. A typical traffic safety checkpoint should have a traffic delay of 30 seconds to a few minutes to drivers.
