If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates, then the monthly water bill for a customer with a 5/8" X 3/4"meter tap using an average of 3,751 gallons per month will increase from \$39.09 to \$48.34. This is an increase of \$9.25 or 23.66%. If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates and a Water Loss Reduction Surcharge, then the monthly water bill for a customer using an average of 3,751 gallons per month will increase from \$39.09 to \$51.07. This is an increase of \$11.98 or 30.64%.

If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates, then the monthly water bill for a customer with a 1"meter tap using an average of 8,190 gallons per month will increase from \$77.53 to \$95.86. This is an increase of \$18.34 or 23.66%. If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates and a Water Loss Reduction Surcharge, then the monthly water bill for a customer using an average of 8,190 gallons per month will increase from \$77.53 to \$98.59. This is an increase of \$21.07 or 27.18%.

If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates, then the monthly water bill for a customer with a 4"meter tap using an average of 363,525 gallons per month will increase from \$2,593.36 to \$3,206.35. This is an increase of \$612.99 or 23.64%. If the Public Service Commission approves the proposed water rates and a Water Loss Reduction Surcharge, then the monthly water bill for a customer using an average of 363,525 gallons per month will increase from \$2,593.36 to \$3,209.08. This is an increase of \$615.72 or 23.74%.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Farmdale Water District. However, the Public Service Commission may order rates to be charged that differ from these proposed rates. Such action may result in rates for consumers other than the rates shown in this notice.
