MLB Speedway Classic tops 85,000 in ticket sales

Workers still have some finishing touches to put on the field inside the racetrack at Bristol Motor Speedway, where a record crowd will watch the Cincinnati Reds play the Atlanta Braves in the MLB Speedway Classic on Saturday.

The game has already has sold more than 85,000 tickets. The first American or National League game ever played in Tennessee will eclipse the previous paid attendance record of 84,587, set on Sept. 12, 1954, when Cleveland Stadium hosted the New York Yankees.

The Speedway Classic, which will be televised nationally by FOX Sports with a first pitch set for 7:15 p.m., will feature pregame pageantry from the U.S. Navy and a ceremonial first pitch between two Hall of Famers: Chipper Jones (Braves) to Johnny Bench (Reds). Game day will include musical performances, with Tim Owen taking the stage for concerts.

'We can't wait for Saturday night ... when that first pitch is thrown out and the stands are full," Jerry Caldwell, Bristol's president and general manager, said last week. "We'll be setting records, we'll be having attendance records. We'll announcing all those details later on, but we'll be there, I know we will.'

The largest crowd ever to see a baseball game was 115,300 for a March 2008 exhibition between the Red Sox and Dodgers at Los Angeles Coliseum. Bristol packed in 156,990 for the Battle of Bristol college football game in 2016.

Officials showed off the work last Friday with a baseball field now sitting on top of the infield inside the half-mile bullring where cars and a building once sat for NASCAR races.

Butterfly count at Big Oaks NWR Saturday Aug. 2

The annual butterfly count at Big Oaks National Wildlife Refuge will be Saturday, Aug. 2, with those participating meeting at the refuge office at 8 a.m.

Forty-six species of butterflies and 1,147 individual butterflies were spotted during the previous year's survey count.

The refuge is especially interested in counting Monarch butterflies, whose populations have recently plummeted. The migratory beauties require native milkweeds to successfully reproduce and the loss of milkweed across the Midwest is one of the primary reasons for their decline.

A\$3 donation to the North American Butterfly Association would be appreciated for those participating in the count. Survey teams will be divided based on the length of time each person wishes to spend in the field. Some may choose to participate for the entire day while others may want to make it a half day. Bring water, bug spray, sunscreen, snacks or lunch and binoculars. Butterfly field guides are recommended, but not required. Long pants are also recommended. 
